## Disco Fever -- The Untold Story

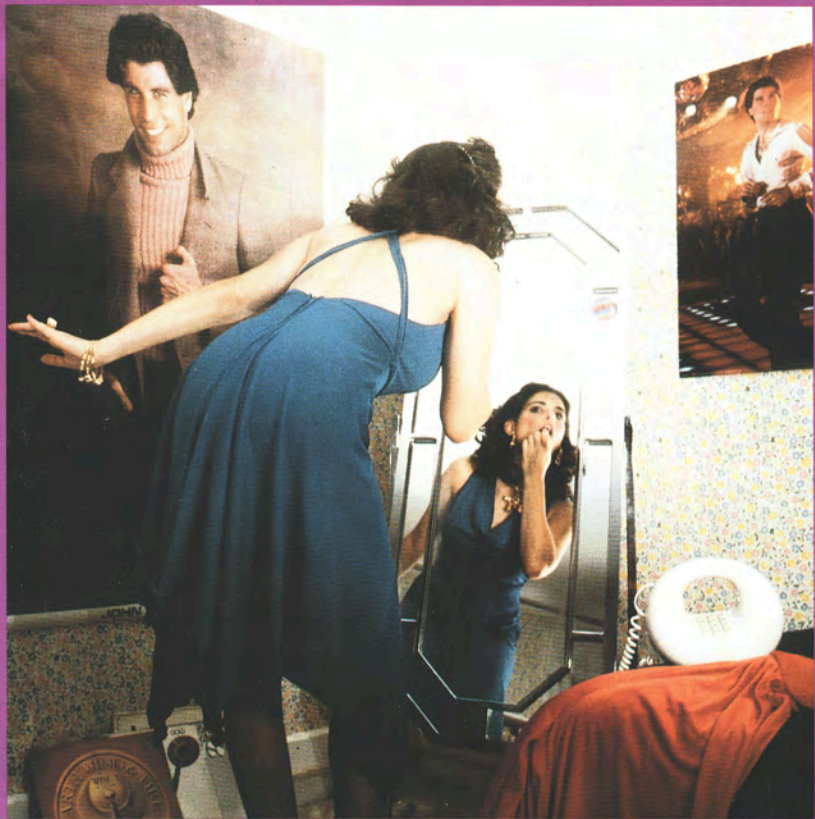
