

If you think you know Christmas music, here's a surprise: It's not all sugary old-movie standards and overplayed mall hymns. R&B artists have repeatedly proven that the feelings brought on by the holiday season can be expressed as soulfully as any other sentiments. The tried-and-true seasonal songs have most of the emotional bases covered, from winter romance (Vanessa Williams on a hot date in **Baby It's Cold Outside**) to a longing for home (Al Green adding soul fire to the classic **I'll Be Home for Christmas**) to wistfulness over Christmases past (Freddie Jackson delivering a poignant take on **Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas**). But some R&B artists, whether rooted in bad-habits blues or church testifying, have been inspired to record original Christmas songs. The sweet sounds of Marvin Gaye's **I Want to Come Home for Christmas** and Isaac Hayes' **The Mistletoe and Me** not only add new shades to the kaleidoscope of established holiday tunes, they're Christmas must-haves waiting to happen.

artist spotlights

Luther Vandross is never content to let someone else control his music; maybe that's why he waited until 1995 to release ***This Is Christmas***, his first full-length holiday album. In the days when he went by just Luther, his self-penned ***May Christmas Bring You Happiness*** made a splash on Atco's essential compilation ***Soul Christmas***. But by

the time ***This Is Christmas*** was released, Vandross had become a soul legend, with a voice recognized worldwide for its lush, burnished warmth and steely, masculine core. He had also gained stature as a songwriter, and brought his writing skills to the project, composing the title tune and six others. A perfectionist behind the microphone and an accomplished engineer in the studio—he has arranged and produced albums for other soul and pop artists throughout his stellar career—Vandross wanted his contribution to holiday music to sound definitive. These two singles are proof that he succeeded; they're plush as a velvet bolster, generous as Santa Claus himself, and as melodic as a thousand bells.



When **Al Jarreau** received his master's degree in psychology, little did he know how useful that training would be even as he rejected the academic life for the glamorous ramble of a working musician. Much of Jarreau's success stems from his keen sensitivity to many different types of music—from intricate bebop to wailing soul to crowd-pleasing pop—and his deep understanding of the emotional power that music has for the listener. No wonder that he's the only artist ever to win Grammys in pop, R&B and jazz; score numerous top-10 hits; and be recognized by music cognoscenti as one of the industry's most accomplished performers. In 1982, after the mainstream success of his best-selling ***Breakin' Away*** album, Jarreau released his version of ***The Christmas Song*** as a single. This litany of all things warm and wonderful about the holiday season was originally immortalized by Nat King Cole, and Jarreau shares with him a light, sensual tenor and a nuanced delivery. But Jarreau adds his own jazz-inspired vocal embellishments, turning one classic into another.



Take 6 toured with Al Jarreau, but this vocal sextet continued down a more enlightened path than that of their onetime stagemate. When college friends Mark Kibble and Claude V. McKnight III put their heads together in the early 1980s and dreamed of founding an old-style spiritual/doo-wop harmony group, there weren't many ensembles in the musical landscape that matched that description.

Kibble and McKnight drafted singers David Thomas, Alvin Chea, Cedric

Joey, and pro-

ceeded to put
not only their
talent but their

faith into action. What followed was a two-decade-plus career, during which the group recorded spirituals, gospel songs and romantic ballads. In keeping with their vow to never record a Christmas album that exploited the sacred meaning of the season, Take 6 released *We Wish You a Merry Christmas* in 1999.

The album was a tour de force; it tapped the spiritual content of the merriest secular tunes—including a swooningly harmonious version of **Winter Wonderland**—and expanded the meaning of the more reverent classics.



After the career slowdown of New Jack Swing trio Bell Biv DeVoe, BBD member Michael Bivins masterminded a new ensemble, one that zeroed in on the vocal-harmony sound popularized by Take 6. Bivins found another wave of success and made superstars of Wanya Morris, Michael McCary, Nathan Morris and Shawn Stockman, a.k.a. **Boyz II Men**.

Their debut album, *Cooleyhighharmony* (1991), lent urban cool to street-corner

doo-wop. The group's hip-hop edge attracted a new generation of fans, while their seamless vocal unity charmed those who were familiar with the sound's musical predecessors of the '50s and '60s. In 1993, Boyz II Men put out a holiday recording called simply *Christmas Interpretations*. The album features the young men doing what they're famous for: claiming a selection of classics by rendering them in their own unique vocal style. A slowed-down and fancied-up **Let It Snow** retains the secular classic's breezy sense of joy while injecting the old tune with lush romanticism.

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
